- Teachers will need to include a self-addressed, stamped envelope in the packets for students to receive their free RGV Ocelots FC tickets.
- A panel of judges will determine the winners. The top 12 winning images will be announced at the Ocelot Conservation Festival held May 1, 2011 at Dean Porter Park in Brownsville, Texas.
- Only winners will be contacted
- Images will not be returned to the artist
- This art contest is a fundraiser for the Friends of Laguna Atascosa National Wildlife Refuge. The Friends
  are trying to raise money to benefit the ocelot, a small cat that is only found here in the lower Rio
  Grande Valley and is very close to becoming extinct in the United States. Funds raised will help buy
  radio collars, telemetry equipment, trip cameras and many other important tools used to study and
  protect ocelots.
